

ABUNE YOSEPH ROCK CLIMBING

LALIBELA, the "Jerusalem of Africa" with its ancient, rock-hewn churches and vivid Christian culture, lies right at the slopes of multi-day trekking peak Abune Yoseph. Together, they form a fascinating holiday destination in the wide and wild Ethiopean Highlands: impressive culture, beautiful nature along the hiking trail, and for the rock climbers a daily dose of well-protected climbs, even up to the very top of Abune Yoseph, rising over 4000m into the African sky!

Spend one or two days exploring Lalibela's extensive church clusters. Hike up to Ad Medhane Alem Community Guesthouse with its breathtaking views, and rock climb its multi-pitch climbing route in warm evening light. Continue uphill next day, past villages and fields, to Agaw Beret Community Guesthouse. If you like to, you can climb Znjero Mama (Baboon Tower) in the evening, typically with lots of its namesakes around. Then it's time for the main summit of Abune Yoseph, often offering best views and weather in the mornings. Three long pitches lead up to its summit ridge, or a hike with a few easy scrambling moves for those in your team not willing to climb. After the summit, return back to Lalibela - a place of warmth, comforts, and recovery after all the days at the mountain!

The best season for a visit is typically from October until January, although conditions may still be sufficient during the following months. The community guest houses are run by the local communities themselves, and need to be booked in advance. This can be done by agencies like www.tesfatours.com, which offer complete packages including food, accommodation, a local to accompany you, and donkeys for your baggage.
